Tour of the Disaster Reduction and Human Renovation Institute (DRI) – Kobe Join Us !

The DRI is a disaster museum that conveys the experiences and lessons learned from the Great Hanshin–Awaji Earthquake that occurred on January 17, 1995 to future generations, and learns how to prepare for the future. You can learn a wide range of disasters from a video screening that reproduces the moment the earthquake occurred, a diorama model that reproduces the cityscape immediately after the earthquake, and a hands-on exhibition.

Now, as an opportunity to think about disaster prevention, mitigation, and reconstruction, we will hold a tour of the DRI.

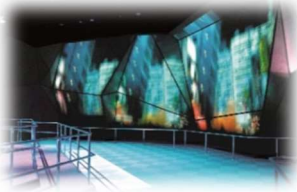
- 10 min. walk from Hanshin Iwaya or Kasuganomichi Station
