

Walking Tour: Kobe City Hall Bldg.No.1 Observation Lobby (100 m above ground) and the Old Foreign Settlement

Attention International Students Staying in Kobe!

The opening of Kobe Port in 1868 (shortly before the Meiji Era) was quickly accompanied by the creation of the Foreign Settlement where foreigners were allowed to freely reside and conduct commercial activities.

Foreign settlements were also established in Yokohama, Kobe, Osaka, Tokyo, etc., but were later abolished and repatriated in Year Meiji 32, or 1899, by revision of relevant treaties. Subsequently, in Kobe, the general area came to be known as the "Old Foreign Settlement".

You can intimately feel Kobe's history through numerous historic sites and monuments scattered around the area.

Now, we have arranged for a "Walking Tour of the Old Foreign Settlement" which hopefully would help you enjoy the cityscape with its exotic atmosphere.
