Attention International Students Staying in Kobe!

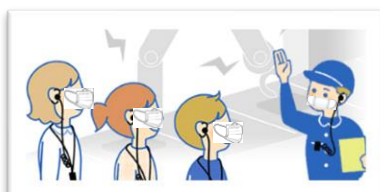
